

- Kindergarten Letter learning, printing practice with HWT digital tool, continuation of number sense, numeracy stations in small groups, winter projects in art, competitive and cooperative games in gym, and Christmas concert selections in music. Busy, busy!
- Grade 1 LA-We are building on our reading skills by learning 2-vowel sounds, and we have started learning how to write a sentence. Math-continuing with numbers to 20 and now starting to increase to 50. Science-we learned what transparent/opaque means! Music- In October we worked on some pretty cool Halloween songs (and in Music 2 & 3 we learned a 6-part song!)
- Grade 2 In ELAL, we just finished up some reading and writing about Remembrance Day. In Math, we are working on representing numbers up to 1000 in 4 different ways: standard form, base ten form, place value form, and expanded form. In Science, we recently completed an experiment to see how hot and cold temperatures would affect 4 different objects. In Social, we have started our Postcard Pals program. We are putting together a postcard to send to schools across Canada, and we will start to receive some postcards this month!
- Grade 3 We have wrapped up our novel study of Ramona Quimby, Age 8. We are focusing on reading nonfiction texts and developing our letter-writing skills.
- Grade 4 The grade 4s are starting to learn about simple machines and have built rollers and wheels so far. They're also learning about the regions of Alberta in Social Studies and are enjoying seeing the different animals that live in this province. We've also started new spelling games in ELA
- Art 2,3,4, Students in Art 2, 3, and 4 made some beautiful Remembrance Day posters and coloured many poppies for our Remembrance Day ceremony. We are now beginning some mixed-media Christmas themed projects.
- Grade 5 We are discussing and build instruments to measure weather. In art we are working on our Remembrance day Posters. In Social 5 we are working our way through the regions of Canada, as well as exploring some current events. We are learning about the Interior Plains region this week.
- Grade 6 Students are reading the novel Hatchet and analyzing how they would act in the situation presented. In math grade 6 continues to be amazing in growing their understanding. We are looking at basic geometric measurements and in music we are preparing for our next concert!
- Grade 7 We are working through algebraic expressions and equations. We've just started our unit on Greek Mythology and have been creating some Percy

Jackson memes, text messages and social media profiles.

- Grade 8 The class has been learning how to multiply and divide fractions and mixed numbers. We are working through a biology unit that includes learning about several of the body systems (circulatory, respiratory, digestive, etc). We have recently started reading "The Hunger Games" novel as a class and the students are quite engaged - asking questions, reading along, etc. It's great!
- Grade 9 Grade 9 - we continue to work on reading and writing - reading a novel together - "The Chrysalids", and writing essays. Gr. 9s have been enjoying tea parties and a variety of food products - from cheesecake to soup. We recently enjoyed being 'short order cooks" and preparing a breakfast menu for a peer. :- )
- Grade 10 Science 10 just made cell models/analogy to a cell model.
- Grade 11 Contributed great presentations to the Remembrance Day Ceremony. Completed a film study on "They Shall Not Grow Old" and then simulated the Treaty of Versailles.
- Grade 12 The English 30 students have been working on a Scrapbook project to showcase their depth of knowledge of one of the people from The Glass Castle. We are now working on our Podcast unit where students will be listening intently to see if they can "solve" the mystery! Students have been working on Reading Comprehension by solving 5 Minute Mysteries. So far, the grade 12 class has solved every case but one. This is pretty incredible! The grade 12 class have also worked with the grade 3 class and the grade 7 class during ELA. This crew is happy to step up and step out to support other learners.
